(a)	Article 8 in Regulatory Agreement 14423/2022. Five percent of the total number of spots must be reserved for individuals with an accredited disability level equal to or above 33%, as well as students with permanent educational support needs linked to personal disability circumstances who required specific resources and support during their previous studies in order to ensure their full educational inclusion.
(b)	Article 8 in Regulatory Agreement 14423/2022. Three percent of the total number of spots must be reserved for high-level and high-performance athletes. This percentage shall be increased to 5% on master's programmes linked to sports science.
(c)	Article 3.2 in Regulatory Agreement 14423/2022. This provision enables undergraduate students who still need to pass their final degree project and, at most, 9 ECTS credits to be admitted to and enrol on a master's programme. Nevertheless, passing their undergraduate degree is a requirement to be awarded the master's qualification.
